Living, Working, Learning Woodlands

We are very pleased to welcome several new members to the Woodland Team in the Forest of Falkland. Our **Woodland Ranger, Sam Docherty**, started in early October, in a post supported for two years by Forestry for People Challenge Funds. **Shawn Gilmour, Colin Gray, Ross Greig, James Laing and Graham Smart** have joined the team as Forestry and Landscape Ranger Assistants for six months until April, with funding from Community Jobs Scotland. Finally, our new Forester will be joining the team in January.

Working with Schools

This Autumn we've been joined by pupils from Glenrothes and Bell Baxter High Schools and primary schools from across Fife for a variety of activities including conservation tasks, bushcraft, woodworking, arts and crafts. Boys from the House of Falkland School worked with local craftsman Tom's Byre at Westfield to make the attractive benches that now sit in front of the workshop – not just somewhere to enjoy the sun on mild days, but with integral planters to grow herbs for the kitchen and attract bees and butterflies next spring and summer. We're also delighted with the new wooden Tree Trail markers made by pupils from Sandy Brae Support Unit. We're very pleased to have secured support from the Forest Education Initiative to run another Introduction to Forestry work placement for Bell Baxter pupils next year.
